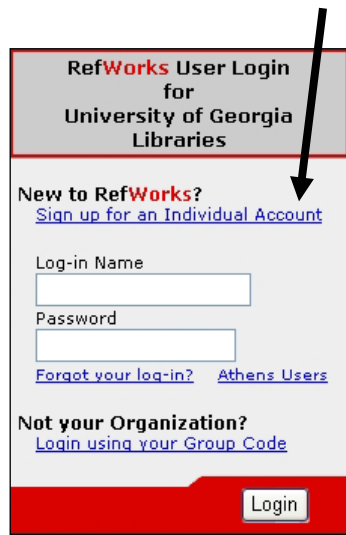


Creating an Account

Your RefWorks account must be created while you are on campus at the University of Georgia. You will receive a **Subscriber Group Code** after you create an account. You may create more than one account, including shared accounts. Remember your login name(s) and password(s).

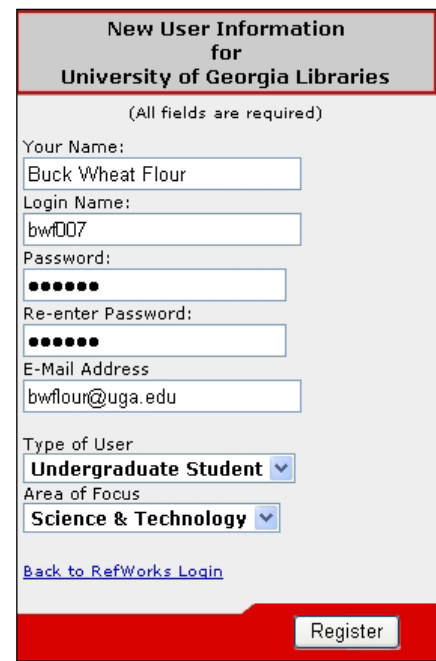

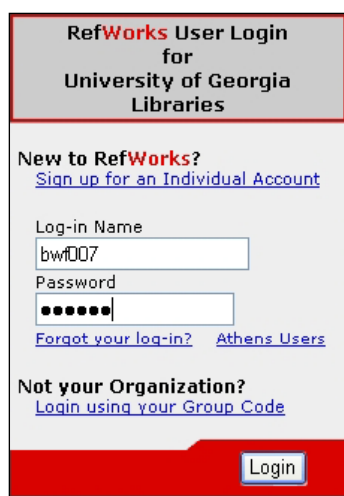

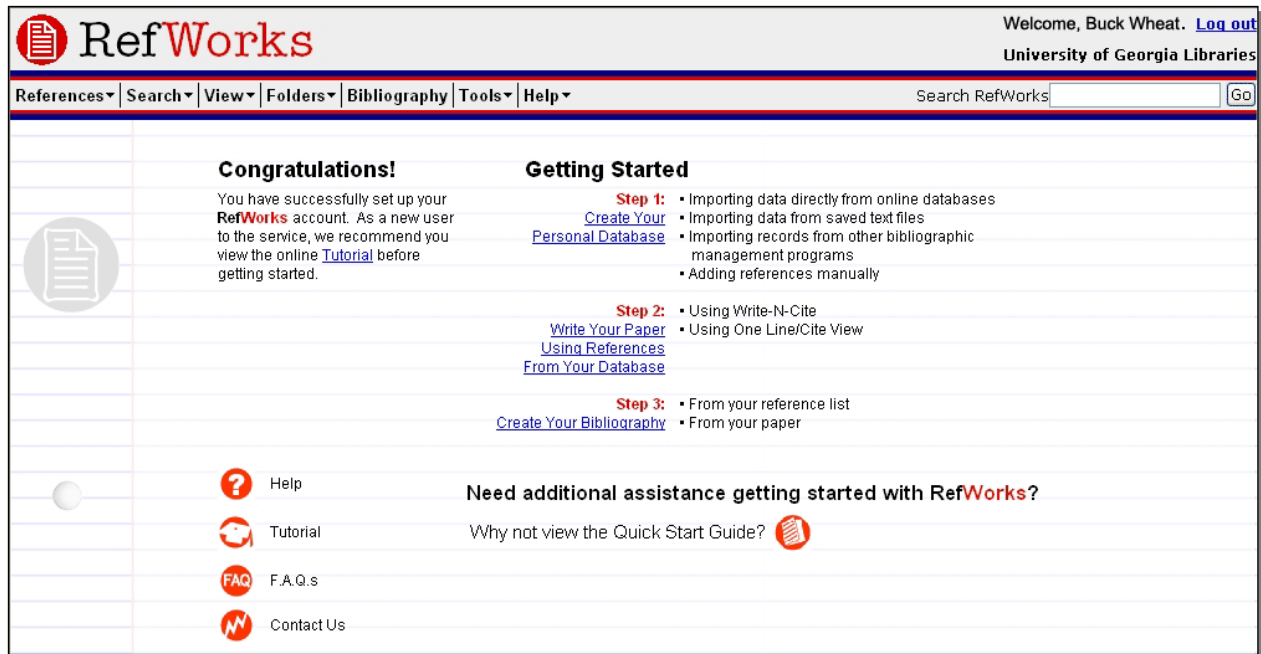

Where Are Citations Stored?

References are stored on the RefWorks server on the World Wide Web.

The benefit of remote storage is that you can input and manipulate your citations from any computer with WWW access. Your references will keep till you need them in a paper or bibliography. There is no limit to the number of references you can store in RefWorks.
