

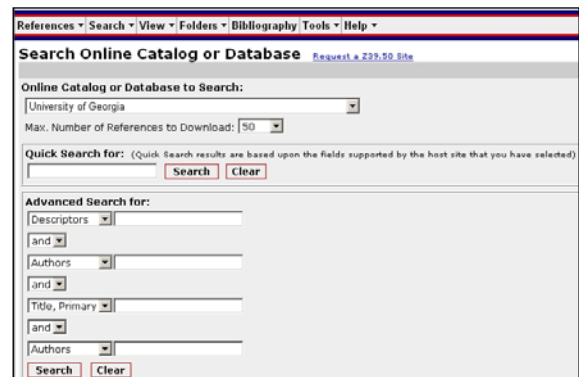
Get References from Online Library Catalogs or PubMed

RefWorks can import references from many libraries' catalogs, and PubMed. The search screens use a standard interface called Z39.50. These screens will look the same no matter which of these resources you are searching. The following examples use GIL@UGA, the UGA Libraries' Catalog.

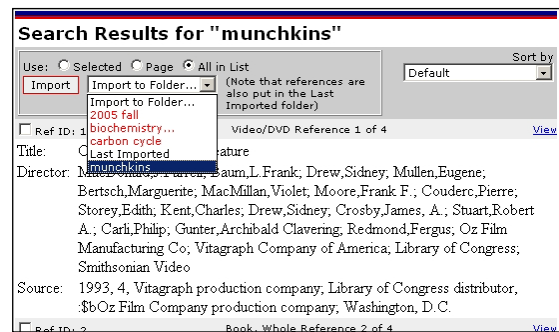
To reach the Z39.50 search screen: *Search > Online Catalog or Database*.



From the drop-down catalog/database menu, select *University of Georgia*. Conduct your search.



A new browser window will open with the results. In this window, select the references you want and **move them** into one of your folders.



Imported references are also saved to *Last Imported*. However, the next time you import or export citations into *Last Imported*, these items will be overwritten.

Difference between Z39.50 and Native Interfaces

The Z39.50 interface has a standard look no matter what catalog you search. Native interfaces are unique to a vendor. They allow full interaction with database search and selection options provided by those vendors (CSA, EBSCO, etc.).

References left in *Last Imported* will be copied to *References Not in a Folder*, and overwritten the next time you import. Move them to one of your other folders.
